"The Very Lonely Firefly"

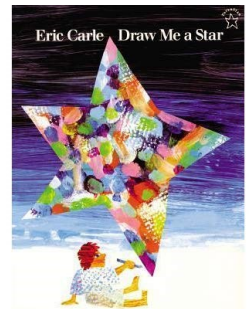
Firefly sets out in the night looking for other fireflies, but what do you think a firefly looks like? Our Bible theme for the week will be the first day of Creation.

Week 2 June 28-July 2

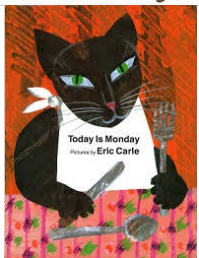
Week 3 July 6-9

**Note: Little Blessings will be closed Monday, July 5th.*

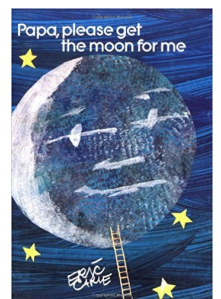


Week 4 July 12-16

Week 6 July 26-30

Genesis 1:24--25 God said, “Let the earth produce every kind of living thing: livestock, crawling things, and wildlife.”

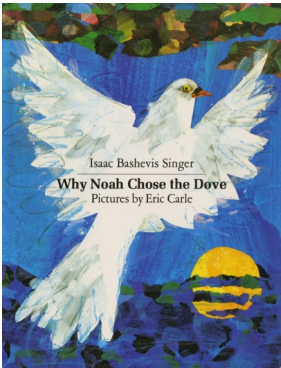


Week 7 August 2-6

“Why Noah Chose the Dove”

Our Bible theme this week will be Noah and this book is a perfect match!

Genesis 8:6-12 After forty days, Noah opened the window of the ark that he had made. He sent out a raven, and it flew back and forth until the waters over the entire earth had dried up. Then he sent out a dove to see if the waters on all of the fertile land had subsided, but the dove found no place to set its foot. It returned to him in the ark since waters still covered the entire earth. Noah stretched out his hand, took it, and brought it back into the ark. He waited seven more days and sent the dove out from the ark again. The dove came back to him in the evening, grasping a torn olive leaf in its beak. Then Noah knew that the waters were subsiding from the earth. He waited seven more days and sent out the dove, but it didn’t come back to him again.

“The Artist Who Painted a Blue Horse”

During our 8th week of Summer Camp we will explore and experiment with colors as we learn about God’s promise that is symbolized by the rainbow.

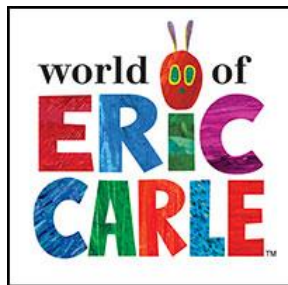
Numbers 13:27 Then they gave their report: “We entered the land to which you sent us. It’s actually full of milk and honey, and this is its fruit.
